

Registration Costs

A ROAP accreditation school will be conducted for persons seeking to become an accredited racing official, steward, or judge. The cost for the 8-day course is \$500 plus a \$30 fee to cover materials. After May 30, 2014 the fee increases to \$550 plus \$30. Attendees are responsible for travel and lodging. Enrollment is limited. You are considered registered when you have paid in full for the course.

The Accreditation Process

Education + Examinations + Experience =
Accreditation

To become accredited, the applicant must:

1) Attend the required education component.

- Flat Racing - All persons must attend the 60-hour educational school.
- Harness Racing - All persons must attend the 60-hour educational school except:

Those who have successfully completed a USTA Extended Officials School and who have been licensed by the USTA as a presiding steward/judge or associate steward/judge and who have had at least 150 days as a steward/judge need only attend a short course or other preparatory seminar of 16 hours conducted by an Accredited Stewards/ Judges School prior to taking the written and oral examinations.

Those who have not completed a USTA Extended Officials School, but with 450 days of experience as a licensed harness steward/judge need only attend a short course of 16 hours given by an Accredited Stewards/Judges School prior to taking the written and oral examination.

- National Steeplechase Association
 - All persons must attend 24-hour accreditation school
 - Pass all required exams: pre-school essay, oral/video, and written

2) Pass all sections of the exam.

- a) Oral;
- b) Film analysis;
- c) Medication and drug testing;
- d) Legal and regulatory issues;
- e) General rules and regulations.

A person failing any section of the examination may retake that section a maximum of two times.

3) Possess the required experience in the racing industry.

Applicants for racing official, steward, and judge accreditation may participate in an accreditation

course and complete examinations before or after acquiring the racing experience required for accreditation. For additional information on the accreditation process visit the ROAP website:

Exam Time Allotment

- General Exam – 1 hour
- Legal Exam – 1 ½ hours
- Medical Exam – 1 ½ hours
- Film Exam – 2 hours
- Oral Exam – 30 minutes

Curriculum

The 60-hour curriculum covers a broad spectrum of subjects including the duties and qualities of racing officials, stewards, and judges; drugs and medications (classification of drugs, effects of race day medication, handling samples, and drug testing procedures); administrative law (commission authority, trainer responsibilities, writing rulings, and conducting hearings); race film analysis; interactions with jockeys, management, and media; operation of the racing secretary's office; mutuel operations; security issues; and other selected topics.

ROAP Apprentice Program

The goal is to educate the racing official apprentice in all aspects of the racing industry, the racetrack, racing official positions, and the stewards' stand, through an immersion program.

To qualify for the program apprentice candidates must have completed the 60-hour ROAP accreditation school, passed the exams, and only lack the experience to become an accredited racing official or steward. Successful completion of the ROAP apprentice program will count towards the 225 day racing official requirement and the additional 50 days requirement as a steward or harness judge.

Along with your application to the apprentice program, you will need to include a letter stating the reasons you would be a strong candidate for the program. Applications can be found at <http://www.horseracingofficials.com/>.
